1. Objectives of the HIRAKU Long-Term Internship

The HIRAKU Long-Term Internship Program is a dispatch program designed to help young researchers develop practical skills and expand their career options while contributing to solving problems in real companies and society.

This internship program aims to train young researchers to be active in various fields outside of academia by encouraging them to acquire the experiences and abilities that they may be particularly lacking, based on their past experiences, research activities, career plans, etc.

2. Applicant Eligibility

Doctoral students (excluding the master program) enrolled at Hiroshima University (Lead Partner Organization of the Consortium), Yamaguchi University and Tokushima University (Co-Partner Organizations of the Consortium) or Okayama University, Shimane University, Tottori University, Ehime University, Kagawa University, Kochi University, Naruto University of Education, Gifu University, National Institute of Genetics, Prefectural University of Hiroshima, Hiroshima City University, Kochi University of Technology, Hiroshima International University and Ritsumeikan University, (Member Organizations), or researchers on fixed-term contracts from the above listed institutes who have completed a doctoral program (excluding the master program) within the last five years or so.

3. Contents of the Long-Term Internship Program

- (1) Host Organization: private companies, public institutions, non-profit organizations, international organizations or primary/secondary educational development institutes, within and outside of Japan
- (2) Term of the Internship: about a month or longer
- (3) Contents of the Program: On-the-Job-Training at the Host Organization, pre-internship training, post-internship training.
- (4) Others: Applicants from Hiroshima University must take the subject class "Long-term internship" at Hiroshima University.

4. Application Procedure

(1) Applicants are supposed to undertake a preliminary consultation before submitting their Application Documents, so please contact the relevant office described in "7. Inquiries".

(2) Application Documents

- ① Application Form (Using the attached prescribed form). Furthermore, if the Host Organization requests you to also submit a form using a format which they specified, please do so.
- ② Research Achievement Report
 You need to extract and download the Achievement Report from within the HIRAKU-PF.

- 3 Letter of Recommendation, written by the applicant's academic supervisor (Using the attached prescribed form)
- **@** Certificate of Enrollment
- ⑤ Written Consent of the representative of your enrolled organization* (Using the attached prescribed form)

(3) Application Period:

April 1, 2024 (Mon) – March 31, 2025 (Mon)

The Host Organization will screen and select applicants based on the submitted Application Documents.
